## SERIES NOTES: LSU LEADS 16-12

- LSU and Louisiana Tech played each other for nine-straight seasons before taking a break last year. The first game of that series was during the 2006-07 season as LSU logged the win, 61-44. That game was part of the Katrina Relief Classic hosted at the New Orleans Arena.
- LSU has won the last 10 -straight games over LA Tech, which includes four-straight victories in Ruston.
- LA Tech's last win over the Lady Tigers was on March 20, 1999, when the third-ranked Lady Techsters earned the $75-52$ win over \#20 LSU in the Sweet 16 hosted in Los Angeles, Calif.
- LA Tech's last victory over LSU in Ruston was by a score of $85-68$ on March 23, 1989 in the Sweet 16.
- LSU and LA Tech have met four times in the NCAA Tournament, all in the Sweet 16 , with Lowisiana Tech holding the advantage, 3-1.
- Longest win streak: LSU (10 games; 3/30/03-12/3/14), LA Tech (8 games; 2/24/79-3/23/89)

Nikki Fargas knows success and what it takes to be successful. Entering her sixth season at the helm of the Lady Tiger Basketball program in 2016-17, Fargas vows to place the Lady Tigers back into national prominence.
"We're going to do everything in our power to make sure that LSU Women's Basketball is back at that elite level, that we are competing for SEC championships, and that we are positioning ourselves to cut down nets," said Fargas.

Fargas has produced a trio of 20 -win seasons and an overall record of 93-71 (.567) in five seasons at LSU. Her 93 victories ranks her as the second-winningest Lady Tiger basketball coach in school history in terms of total wins, just behind legendary coach Sue Gunter. In her first five seasons, LSU has secured four NCAA Tournament appearances highlighted by back-to-back trips to the NCAA Sweet 16, and 18 victories over ranked opponents.

Fargas, who won national championships as both a player and an assistant coach at Tennessee and turned UCLA into a national power in just three years, has that combination of outstanding in-game coaching ability and tremendous recruiting competence. In addition, Fargas has been a leader off the court in the Baton Rouge community, helping the Lady Tigers connect with the city of Baton Rouge while donating their time and efforts to making a difference. She and her Lady

Tigers were heavily involved in assisting residents and local church communities following the devastating flood in August 2016 that impacted thousands of people in the area.

In the classroom, LSU has been a shining example of the definition of student-athlete. The Lady Tigers have recorded a perfect score of 100 in graduation success rate released by the NCAA during three seasons under Fargas. For players who have exhausted their eligibility at LSU, Fargas boasts a 100 -percent graduation rate. Over the last five years, the Lady Tigers have earned 18 SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades.

Well respected in coaching circles, Fargas has twice been selected by the USA Women's Basketball Committee to serve as an assistant coach for USA National Teams. In the summer of 2012, she became the first coach in LSU history to serve on a USA U18 team staff since the squad's inception in 1988. That team claimed the gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship. In the summer of 2013, most of that group reunited to lead the USA U19 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA World Championships in Lithuania. Fargas is the only coach in LSU history to claim multiple USA gold medals during her tenure as Lady Tiger head coach.

Fargas has been a part of a championship and winning pedigree at every level of her career and owns an impressive 570-172 record as a player, graduate assistant, assistant
coach and head coach dating back to her freshman season at Tennessee. She played, coached and studied under one of the game's greatest figures, the legendary Pat Summitt at Tennessee and she assisted Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Debbie Ryan at Virginia.

Widely recognized as one of the nation's top assistant coaches during stints at Tennessee and Virginia, Fargas took over at UCLA in 2008. In three years with the Bruins, she turned around a UCLA program that had won only one NCAA Tournament game in the nine years prior to her arrival. Fargas led the Bruins to a 72-26 (.735) overall mark, reached the NCAA Tournament twice and finished second in the Pac-10 Conference in both 2010 and 2011.

Off the court, Fargas is a passionate crusader for breast cancer awareness. She and Tennessee head coach Holly Warlick founded the non-profit organization, Champions for a Cause. Since 2007, they have raised over $\$ 300,000$ through Cruisin' for a Cause, a long-haul motorcycle adventure to raise dollars and awareness for a cure for breast cancer.

Fargas, was raised in Oak Ridge, Tenn., by her mother, Jean Caldwell. She and her husband Justin Fargas are the proud parents of a four-year-old daughter, Justice Simone Fargas.

BATON ROUGE, La. --- Senior forward Alexis Hyder dominated the post on both sides of the ball, finishing with 25 points and eight rebounds in LSU's 81-34 win over LeMoyne-Owen at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center on Sunday.

Hyder also added three assists and four steals in 32 minutes of action. Senior guard Rina Hill distributed the ball often to Hyder and finished the afternoon with a game-high five assists to go along with eight points. The Lady Tigers had assists on 24 of their 35 buckets today.

The Lady Tigers were without the services of Raigyne Moncrief, Tatum Neubert, Faustine Aifuwa and Ayana Mitchell. Neubert had surgery for an injury she sustained this summer and will miss the early part of the season. Moncrief is returning following a knee injury she suffered last season and is expected to be ready when the team faces Louisiana Tech on Friday.
"We held Raigyne out and she is someone who we are going to evaluate on a daily basis with her coming back from her knee injury," explained head coach Nikki Fargas. "She is going to be ready to go for our season opener on Friday. We just wanted to be a little cautious with her. I like that our team responded and we got a lot of minutes distributed around the team today."

Guard Jaelyn Richard-Harris was the first freshman to see the court for the Lady Tigers, coming in as a sub in the first quarter and finishing with four points, four assists and four steals in 21 minutes.

Jenna Deemer led the Lady Tigers from beyond the arc with an aggressive three-point shooting effort, finishing with 17 points on $7-$-of- 12 shooting.

Sophomore Chloe Jackson set the tone early, scoring five of the Lady Tigers' first seven points leading to a 14-5 first quarter lead for LSU.
"We were excited to take the court today against Lem-oyne-Owen," said Fargas. "It's been a challenging few weeks for our team and they responded today. Defensively, I thought our effort to try to disrupt Lemoyne paid off for us, and it allowed us to get some transition baskets, which we like. Our defensive effort was good. We were able to come up with some deflections and steals.
"We had a 2-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio. Twenty-four assists is definitely a stat that jumps out to me. We played very unselfish passing the ball, and were really looking to get the best shot for our team. As we move forward we're going to examine this film. We'll highlight the things we did well and go back to work on the things that challenged us."

The baskets kept coming in the second quarter for the Lady Tigers, who outscored LeMoyne-Owen 25-7 en route to a 39-12 halftime lead.

After the half, Hyder continued attacking the rim, scoring four of LSU's five baskets during a 12-2 run before being subbed out for freshman Yasmine Bidikuindila.

Hyder returned later in the third quarter and formed a physical pairing with Bidikuindila, who had five points, two rebounds and a blocked shot in her limited action.

Deemer added two more three pointers in the fourth quarter, which saw LSU outscore LeMoyne-Owen 13-4 in the final minutes of the game to close out a strong showing for the Lady Tigers.

One of the keys to LSU's 47-point victory was tough defense, which led to 37 points off turnovers for the team. LSU's bench also outscored LeMoyne-Owen's bench 26-5 as several reserve players got involved throughout the game.

## Lady Tigers in Season Openers

The Lady Tigers open their 42nd season of women's basketball action at Louisiana Tech on Friday. LSU is 32-9 all-time in season openers. The longest streak of opening day wins is eight games from the 2000-01 season to the 2007-08 season. LSU is looking to snap a streak of two-straight opening day losses. The Lady Tigers fell to Wake Forest on the road in 2015-16 and lost to Little Rock in the PMAC to open the 2014-15 season. There has been only one season opener that went into overtime, and that was to tip off the 2002-03 season. LSU, ranked No. 3 at the time, defeated Arizona on the road, 78-71.

## Nikki Fargas in Season Openers

Head coach Nikki Fargas is entering her sixth season with the Lady Tigers and holds a 3-2 record in season openers. Her squads won their first three season openers over Wichita State (2011-12 on the road and 2012-13 at home), and Stephen F. Austin (2013-14 at home) before dropping the last two to Wake Forest and Little Rock. Fargas is 1-1 in season openers on the road and 2-1 in season openers at home.

## LSU is 12-5 in Season Openers on the Road

The Lady Tigers have opened their season on the road 17 times in the 41-year history of the program and LSU is 12-5 in those games. In the last 10 years, LSU has only opened the season on the road three times, and is 1-2 in those contests.

## Against Louisiana Teams in Season Opener...

The Lady Tigers are 13-1 when opening the season against a team from the Pelican State. The only loss was to McNeese State to open the 1981-82 season. In her five seasons, head coach Nikki Fargas has never opened a season against a Louisiana squad, and LSU has never opened a season against Louisiana Tech. The most common Louisiana teams that LSU has opened with have been Southeastern Louisiana (4-0) and Tulane (3-0).

## Fargas is $12-4$ vs Louisiana Schools

Head coach Nikki Fargas is 12-4 against Louisiana universities in her five seasons at LSU. All four of her losses have been to Tulane, which LSU hosts on Dec. 11. ## Homecoming for Mickie DeMoss

Mickie DeMoss joined the Lady Tigers in May 2016 after spending the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons as associate head coach at Louisiana Tech. A native of Tallulah, La., DeMoss was a player on the inaugural Lady Techster team in 1974 and lettered for the first three years of the program's existence. She was the very first point guard in the history of the program. DeMoss earned her bachelor's degree in physical education from LA Tech in 1977.

## Newbies Outnumber Vets on LSU Roster

The Lady Tigers are fairly inexperienced heading into the 2016-17 season as seven of the 13 players have not logged action in 30 games or more in their careers. While the roster includes seniors Alexis Hyder, Rina Hill and Jasmine Rhodes, juniors Jenna Deemer and Raigyne Moncrief and sophomore Shanice Norton, there are two sophomore transfers (Tatum Neubert \& Chloe Jackson) and five freshmen (Ayana Mitchell, Yasmine Bidikuindila, Faustine Aifuwa, Jaelyn Richard-Harris and Stephanie Self.) Jackson and Neubert have not seen game action on the court since the 2014-15 season, and Jackson only played four games that season because of an injury. Mitchell was poised to make a run for SEC freshman honors last season and was sidelined with a back injury after just three games last year. Bidikuindila, Aifuwa, Richard-Harris and Self are all true freshmen this year. The vets have Moncrief back in their arsenal as the junior missed all but three games last year with a knee injury.

## Tough Schedule

While LSU finished the season at just 10-21 last season, they played one of the toughest schedules in the country. According to the RPI rankings, the Lady Tigers were №. 4 in strength of schedule, which was good for second in the SEC - only behind Tennessee - which LSU defeated at the PMAC, 57-56, on Feb. 21, 2016. With its SEC schedule and a non-conference schedule that includes UConn and seven other teams that advanced to post-season play last year, the Lady Tigers are likely to have a high ranking for strength of schedule when the RPI stats come out after the start of the season.

## Big Lex on the Boards

Senior Alexis Hyder returns as LSU's leading scorer and rebounder from the 2015-16 campaign. Hyder averaged 12.2 points per game and notched 10 double-doubles. Averaging 7.9 boards per game, she hauled in double-digit rebounds in six conference games, including back-to-back meetings with a career-tying 15 boards against \#18 Kentucky and 12 boards versus Georgia. In just conference games, Hyder ranked eighth in rebounding and was second in the league in offensive boards with 58 . She ended the season ranked №. 1 in the SEC in offensive rebounds in all games with 122.
